



Frameworks is an upper elementary program (4th-6th) that builds learning skills, introduces the classroom setting, and provides academic accountability — while maintaining home instruction as the primary source of education.

- Classroom teachers direct lessons, plan assignments, collect work, initiate assessments, and post grades
- The Weekly Assignment Sheet (WAS) provides a checklist that includes 3 days of assignments for – Literature, Writing Instruction, History, and Science.
- Students are responsible for following the curriculum and completing all WAS assignments. At home, parents guide their students through the completion of the WAS and assist as needed. In addition, parents teach lessons, record grades, and complete monthly reports for subjects not covered in the Frameworks program – Math, Bible, Spelling, Grammar skills.
