Required Summer Reading (3) by C.S. Lewis from the *Chronicles of Narnia* series:

The Magician's Nephew

The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe

The Horse and His Boy

As you read, think about... C.S. Lewis, the author of *The Chronicles of Narnia*, once wrote of the character Aslan: "He is an invention giving an imaginary answer to the question, 'What might Christ become like if there really were a world like Narnia, and He chose to be incarnate and die and rise again in that world as He actually has done in ours?'"

Thinking a little deeper... If Aslan is meant to be an imaginative telling of how Christ might be "fleshed out" in Narnia, what does Aslan reveal about the nature of Christ?

Assignment Directions: For each of the novels, list two quotations, a citation for each quote, and provide an explanation of 6-8 sentences that demonstrate the parallels between Aslan and Christ. You will have a total of six quotations, citations, and explanations - *two from each book*.

The Magician's Nephew – C.S. Lewis

Quotation 1: Select a quote, list it, and provide a citation for the quote.

"Provide a direct quotation from the text and place it correctly in quotation marks" (The citation in parentheses should include: author's last name, title of book that is capitalized and italicized page #) ← Put the period outside of the parentheses.

Example: "This is a story about something that happened long ago when your grandfather was a child" (Lewis, *Magician's* 1).

Explanation: Write a paragraph of 6-8 sentences that explains what the quote reveals about Aslan as a character who displays the nature of Christ. Include textual support from the novel to build your argument.

Quotation 2: Select a quote, list it, and provide a citation for the quote.

"Provide a direct quotation from the text and place it correctly in quotation marks" (The citation in parentheses should include: author's last name, title of book that is capitalized and italicized page #). ← Put the period outside of the parentheses.

Example: "Digory's heart beat wildly; he knew something very solemn was going to be done" (Lewis, *Magician's* 125).

The Horse and His Boy – C.S. Lewis

Quotation 1: Select a quote, list it, and provide a citation for the quote.

“Provide a direct quotation from the text and place it correctly in quotation marks” (The citation in parentheses should include: author’s last name, title of book that is capitalized and italicized page #). ← Put the period outside of the parentheses.

Example: “On these occasions he usually slept with the donkey in its little thatched stable” (Lewis, *Horse* 5).

Explanation: Write a paragraph of 6-8 sentences that explains what the quote reveals about Aslan as a character who displays the nature of Christ. Include textual support from the novel to build your argument.

Quotation 2: Select a quote, list it, and provide a citation for the quote.

“Provide a direct quotation from the text and place it correctly in quotation marks” (The citation in parentheses should include: author’s last name, title of book that is capitalized and italicized page #). ← Put the period outside of the parentheses.

Example: “If the Prince succeeds, we have Archenland, and perhaps hereafter Narnia” (Lewis, *Horse* 121).

Explanation: Write a paragraph of 6-8 sentences that explains what the quote reveals about Aslan as a character who displays the nature of Christ. Include textual support from the novel to build your argument.
